授業の概要 Course Overview	In addition to introducing key concepts and issues of economic development this course gives practical understanding and experiences of how pro-poor policies work in practice in the field of international development- the focus mostly comes from the instructors` continued high quality empirical research including randomized control trails (RCTs). The course will also give exposure about how tools of macroeconomics, microeconomics, econometrics and machine learning, international trade, etc. are applied to understanding the problems of development, and how data and empirical evidence can shed light on conflicting views and questions about the process of development.		
履修条件・注意 事項 Prerequisites / Remarks	<p>-Generally speaking, there is no strict prerequisite to join this course. However, learning MS-EXCEL in advance (who are still not familiar with) will be useful to solve some Ms-excel based empirical problems in development economics as homework.</p> <p>-Some tools will be used from Econometrics/Statistics, microeconomics, international trade, and macroeconomics.
